Arrival Day

Potential first surprise: Key.

You just arrived at your apartment or bungalow and the front door won't open? Don't panic. Sometimes it requires a bit of time and empathy until you get used to the individual needs of your door. In general it should work more smoothly if you use one hand to pull the door gently towards yourself and the other to turn the key clockwise twice. Then push it. Be careful with the keys in your own interest. The administration will charge you ≤ 25 per broken or bent key and ≤ 150 in case you lose one.

Notice of Damages.

Check your bungalow for defects like broken furniture or permanent dirt. Note down any of those defects in the notice of damages you got in the administrative office on your arrival. Hand it in as soon as possible. Make a copy for yourself. Take some pictures of the damages as well. Otherwise, you might struggle to prove the original condition at the end of the rental term. In that case YOU might have to pay for damages caused by the previous tenant.

Parking

The first question most people ask themselves after moving in is: 'Where should I park to bring my furniture to me?'. There are actually two options. Either you try to get hold of a much sought-after parking space in Connollystraße (free of charge, and especially practical for the rear bungalows and HJK), or you can make do with the multi-storey car park. The cost here is €2 for the whole day if you have a Park+Ride ticket (e.g. the Deutschland-Ticket).

Residents' Registration Office

Don't forget to register your new residence at the Department of Public Order (Kreisverwaltungsreferat/KVR) within one week! Bring the landlord confirmation issued by the Student Union Munich.

Newcomer Tour

Tips on Living

Tutors

If you have any problems (noise, borrowing a barbecue, borrowing a beer bench, participating in community life in the village...) it is best to contact a tutor first. The tutors live directly in the village, know their way around very well and will be happy to help you with almost any problem.

You can also ask questions in the WhatsApp group **Q&A** - **Dorfleben** which are usually answered quickly by the more experienced students.

Residential time

When you move in, you will receive a tenancy agreement that is limited to the expected duration of your studies. However, you are entitled to a certain period of residence during your first degree, which you can apply for from the administration if you need it. If you move in during your Bachelor's/state examination, this is 7 semesters, for the Master's 4 semesters. You also have the opportunity to extend your period of residence here by volunteering in the dorm life. You can find more information on this in the chapter "Student self-administration".

Administrative office

You already know the Studentenwerk's property management from your application and moving in. It is located in the Community Center (GEZ, abbreviation for "Gemeinschaftszentrum")), Helene-Mayer-Ring 9, north entrance.

The property management is responsible for renting out the apartments and parking spaces. Questions relating to the rental agreement can be discussed here.

Technical office

If you have any questions about technical matters, you can contact the technical office. Their office is located opposite the property management office.

Janitors

The janitor's office is located diagonally below the staircase to the laundry room. Opening hours:

Monday - Thursday 2.30 pm - 3.30 pm on Friday 11:30 am - 12.30 pm

Here you can get spare parts directly, such as light bulbs or fluorescent tubes, if you fill out a damage report form and present your ID card. It is best to bring the defective part with you.

Damages

If damage occurs in your apartment, on your floor or in your alley (e.g. broken lighting), you must write a damage report.

If you have not caused the damage yourself (e.g. due to wear and tear), you do not have to pay for the repair or replacement yourself. In all other cases, you should note that the repair costs consist of the material price and the labor costs for the janitor; you can save the latter if you do the work yourself.

Technical emergency service

You can reach us by phone at: 0175 2905730 Office hours:

If problems occur during the day, please contact the janitors.

Responsibilities of the technical emergency service:

- He will contact you by 4 p.m. if the emergency bell is pressed in the stuck elevator. After 4 p.m., a security company takes care of it.

- It helps with technical emergencies such as burst water pipes, power failures, etc.


No electricity

If the music suddenly goes off, the lights go out and the stove stops heating, you have probably blown a fuse. The first thing you should do is switch off and unplug all appliances. If your stove is wet, wipe it dry. Then you can check the fuse box for a blown fuse. In the bungalows the box is placed downstairs inside the big wardrobe. In the high-rise apartments it's in the wardrobe right next to the entrance and in the HJK it's directly next to the door on the bathroom side. If your apartment is still dark, contact the janitors or the technical emergency service.

WhatsApp

To stay connected in the village, it is highly recommended to join the individual WhatsApp groups. There is a *Olydorf* - *News* community for the whole of Olydorf, where all events and information are posted.

There is also a single group for your area of the village (High-rise, Bungalows, HJK), with a group for your alley/floor. If your alley/floor speaker has not yet had time to welcome and add you, you can also join using the QR code. You can also find the other groups in the descriptions of these groups. Have fun browsing!



Locked out

Even the most experienced Olydorf residents will find themselves standing in front of their locked apartment door without a key at some point. To save you time and effort, it is advisable to keep the spare key with your trusted neighbor.

Our janitors will lock your apartment during their business hours:

(Monday to Thursday from 07.00 - 15.30, Friday from 07.00 - 12.30) free of charge. However, remember to prepare your rental contract and ID to confirm your identity.

If the Bierstube is open, you can ask for the unlocking professionals there with a wink. If none of this helps, you can also call the paid locksmith service (company "MAZ", phone: 089 507070).



Internet connection

Internet access now has the same importance as running water. The exact settings to be made can be found on the information sheet that you should have received by email when you moved in. If not, simply ask the administration again.

If you have any problems with the setup, you can visit the OlyNet office (on the second floor of the tower block) or contact OlyNet e.V. on Facebook or Instagram. OlyNet will also be happy to help you with other IT-related problems. You can find the current office hours on the **Instagram page** and on www.olynet.club.

Television/Radio

You can receive radio and television via the antenna socket in your apartment. However, the installation of satellite dishes is prohibited - exceptions must be approved by the technical office.

Telephone connection

Every bungalow and apartment has a network connection as well as a telephone socket. This gives you the option of having a landline connection activated. This is particularly useful in the new bungalows, as cell phone reception is unfortunately severely impaired there.

Remodeling and structural alterations

In the case of alterations of any kind, the property management requires that you restore the property to its original condition when you move out if your new tenant does not want to take over the alterations. Of course, this also applies if you have taken them over from your previous tenant. You must remove the alterations yourself, otherwise the Studierendenwerk will charge you for the removal. The janitors cannot take custody of furnishings that are in your way (e.g. bed frames, mattresses, chairs, etc.).

Painting the Bungalows

One of the things that makes our village so special is that you have the opportunity to paint the front façade of your bungalow according to your own ideas. You may only use the paint that you can borrow from the tutors. For more information, simply contact the tutors. Before the painting can be approved, however, you must first send a sketch of your plan to uk@stwm.de and get the design approved.

Not to be painted are: Front doors, windows, doorbells and joints.

Bicycle storage

In the bungalow area, in the middle of the main alley, right next to the mailboxes, you will find underground bicycle cellars that you can open with your bungalow key. Please make sure that this door remains closed at all times, also in your own interest. For high-rise residents, the bicycle cellar is located at the rear of the P&R underground garage.

Shopping

Just moved in and the fridge is empty. Don't you worry, you'll find all kinds of shopping opportunities in the shopping street north of the GEZ. There is an Edeka, bakeries, hairdressers, kebab stores, pizza stores, an Asian market and more. For larger purchases, drugstores or shopping, the Olympia Einkaufszentrum (OEZ) is just two subway stops away. There are also one or two supermarkets and drugstores at Bonner Platz.

Benches

The benches on the grassy areas or on Marienplatz are managed by the bench sitters. These are lent out by the sitters, especially in summer, and you can use them for barbecues, for example! You can find the current list of bench sponsors on the Instagram page of the Gras Committee (@gras.olydorf).

Tips on Living

Important deadlines

Submit the certificate of enrollment to Onlineportal by 1st of November in the winter semester or 1st of May in the summer semester at the latest.

Application for an extension of the residence period by 15th of December in the winter semester or 15th of June in the summer semester at the latest by email to the administration if your regular residence period is over after the semester. But don't worry, you will normally receive an email from Stuwerk as a reminder for both deadlines!

Waste separation

Admittedly, sorting waste can be a little difficult if you barely have enough space to live in. Nevertheless, there are ways for you to dispose of your waste properly. You will find the black residual waste garbage cans and the blue paper waste garbage cans for the bungalows right next to your letterboxes. For high-rise residents, the nearest garbage cans are located between the high-rise building and the parking deck.

Yellow garbage cans for plastic and packaging waste and red garbage cans for scrap metal can be found between the bungalows at the beginning of H-Alley, which is very centrally located for everyone.

Of course, we also have organic waste garbage cans. These are located at Marienplatz, but as waste that doesn't belong in the organic waste bins often ends up here, they are only open at certain times. You can find the exact opening times in the WhatsApp groups or on Instagram at @gras.olydorf.

Parking spaces

As a villager, you have the option of renting a parking space in the parking garage. Depending on the floor, this costs $\in 10$ (ground floor + upper floor) to $\in 20$ (basement).

If you want to rent a parking space, you can simply contact the administration.

ZHS

At the central university sports facility (ZHS, for "Zentraler Hochschul Sport"), you can do sports for little money. Most of the courses take place on the TUM campus in the Olympic Park, right on your doorstep. There is a huge range of different sports on offer here, at extremely reasonable prices. So if you like doing sports or want to try something new, make sure you stop by here. If you don't want to go alone, you can also just contact our sports committee, where there are WhatsApp groups for many different sports.

There is also the mensa on campus, which you can also visit as a nice opportunity for lunch.

Towards the park, there is also the ZHS beach and tennis facility, where you can rent courts to play beach volleyball, tennis or pickleball at reasonable prices.

General tips

Intrusion protection:

Don't just close the front door, lock it too, otherwise the insurance won't pay anything in the event of a break-in! The balcony door must be locked from the inside, otherwise it can be opened from the balcony. Keep it closed when you are away (in winter because of the heating alone).

Clogged sink:

Please do not pour hot fat (not oil!) down the sink after frying. When the fat is cold and solid, it can block the drainpipe. So it is better to wait until the fat is solid and then dispose of it in the residual waste.

Fogged bungalow windows/mold:

To prevent the windows from fogging up, we recommend airing them properly twice a day and wiping the window with a cloth once a day. If mold forms anywhere in the bungalow, please report this quickly to the janitor (damage report).

Mailboxes:

The mailboxes of the bungalows are located next to the garbage and paper garbage cans at the ends of the alleys - sometimes you have to search a bit to find the right one.

In the high-rise building, the letterboxes are located in the foyer on the first floor.

Community center (GEZ) / Alte Mensa

Next to the "Kiosk" in summer, the GEZ is the center of village life. Here you will find the Bierstube, the OlyDisco, the OlyLounge, the laundry room, the workshop, the music practice rooms, the reading room, the pottery room, the student self-administration club office and also the meeting room of the Presidential Board.

The Bierstube

In summer: Monday to Saturday 8:00 pm - 12:30 am In winter: Monday to Saturday 6:30 pm - 1:00 am

Closing time is $\frac{1}{2}h$ before closing time. The kitchen closes at 22:00 pm.



With the Bierstube we have our own student bar in the middle of the village. It is located on the first floor on the high-rise side of the GEZ and is run entirely by students from the OlyDorf; it thus serves us villagers both as a nearby workplace and as a cozy meeting place and inexpensive restaurant. With its freshly tapped drinks, it is well-known in the city and is highly appreciated for its family atmosphere and student prices.

Our offer:

In addition to the Bierstuben classics of currywurst or chicken schnitzel, there are always special events and offers. Apart from the occasional karaoke evenings, live bands on stage or public viewing, there is a weekly burger day every Tuesday. Here you can easily order your burger according to your own preferences. Of course, we also offer vegan or vegetarian alternatives for most dishes. Snacks such as pretzels, warm nachos, chips or cauliflower nuggets are also available to satisfy small appetites.

As the name suggests, the Bierstube is the beer specialist in the village: Here you will find everything your heart desires, from classic light or white beer to Goaßmaß, Kellerbier, Vitus and much more! Of course, white or red wine, as well as wine spritzers, various schnapps and non-alcoholic drinks from cola to apple juice spritzer and mineral water are also offered here. As a special offer, there are changing daily schnapps.

Pottery room

Every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. you can work with clay in the pottery room on the potter's wheel or using the building technique. All you have to do is come to the first floor of the community center at the "e" entrance on the west side of the building.

Tip: If you have never made pottery before or are a bit "out of practice", it is best to come on Tuesdays, as our experienced master potters will be on hand to help and advise you.

Music practice rooms

The music practice rooms are located on the west side under the entrance 'd', at the very back by the street. There are two music rooms, which are equipped with both pianos and drums.

Every tenant can receive a practice room key after paying a small deposit and can then practice there at any time for a semester fee (unless someone else has registered in the occupancy plan). For more information you can simply write an email to musik@oly-dorf.de

Workshop

You can borrow small machines and tools from A to Z from the workshop during opening hours (see WhatsApp or Instagram @werkstatt_olydorf). You can ask the workshop committee for a detailed list of the tools you can borrow.

You can also order bed enlargements, have your bikes repaired and even have your skis and snowboards prepared for the winter. The wood workshop has a circular table saw, planer and thicknesser, milling machine, band saw, lathe,

planing benches, clamping wall and other professional equipment. This provides possibilities that otherwise almost only commercial companies can offer.



The metal workshop is equipped with gas-shielded and oxyfuel welding equipment, a metal circular saw, lever-action plate shears, a bending machine, a pillar drill, a jack, a wide range of bicycle tools and compressed air. We also have equipment for preparing snowboards and skis. Recently, we even have our own bike workshop where you can prepare your bike perfectly for the summer.

The prerequisite for using the workshop is participation in an introductory workshop course run by the workshop committee (WA). In addition, milling, turning, welding and electrical introduction courses are also offered if required. Anyone wishing to take part in a course can simply attend a meeting of the workshop committee. Everything will be explained there. You can find more information about the workshop committee in the next chapter under "Workshop Committee (WA)".

Kiosk

You will find the kiosk on Marienplatz in the middle of the bungalows. This is where things get wild, especially in summer, but even in winter there are often one or the other mulled wine evenings here. In summer there are popular barbecues here and our summer festival Copa Connolly also takes place here.

In addition, the GRAS committee regularly opens the gates here and sells flower pots, seeds, honey from our own bees and opens the organic waste garbage cans.

Community rooms in the high-rise (GAPs)

The common rooms in the high-rise, also known as GAPs, are managed by the tutors. Most of them are currently being renovated, which is why only a few are available. The rest are used by the tutors for events, which is why private use is unfortunately not possible at the moment. However, this will hopefully change again in the future.

Reading room

The reading room is our own reference library on the 1st floor of the old canteen, where you can go to study if your own apartment (or your neighbors) are too distracting. Alternatively, there are various journals and books in a wide range of subjects available to you.

You can access the internet via the eduroam or LRZ network. The reading room supervisor can help you with the setup.

Opening hours: Daily from 09.00 - 21.00.

Laundry room

The laundry room is located on the second floor of the community center, opposite the entrance to the high-rise-A entrance. You can open the lock with your apartment key. There you will find washing machines, dryers and a detergent dispenser at reasonable prices. A washing machine cycle costs ≤ 0.5 , a dryer cycle ≤ 0.4 and two tabs of detergent ≤ 1 . The laundry room is open all day, seven days a week.

Nursery-Childcare centre

The nursery is located on the ground floor of the GEZ. The facility also includes a garden, which forms the end of the bungalows just a few meters from the nursery.

Beekeepers

The "Bienen im Olymp" (Bees in Olympus) apiary is made up of several bee colonies and nature-loving students from Olydorf. In addition to the regular care of the bees, other projects relating to nature and the insects that live there are also implemented.

During guided tours, visitors learn interesting facts about honey bees and the work of us beekeepers. In the cosmetics courses we offer, various products are made from wax, such as lip balms, candles or environmentally friendly beeswax wipes.

As not only honey bees are important to us, but also native wild bees, butterflies, lizards and birds, we also maintain a wild bee garden between the bungalows. Here we provide nesting aids for bumblebees and plant various wild flowers to give the animals food and a habitat.

Everyone can contribute creative ideas to pass on the enthusiasm for bees. Everyone is welcome to come and visit us.

Student self-administration

Studenten im Olympiazentrum e.V.

Although it is hard to believe, practically everything presented in the last chapter is run and managed by villagers, i.e. students.

The self-administration in the Oberwiesenfeld student dorm has been established as a registered association called "Studenten im Olympiazentrum e.V." (Students in the Olympic Centre e.V.) for 50 years now.

Our association is made up of different parts. Starting with the committees, which are introduced on the next page, each of which looks after a specific area of the village. This is where most people in the association start, as there is no better way to make friends in the village than to share the same interests in a committee. The committees meet at regular intervals (usually every two weeks). You are dearly invited to come along and have a look. The exact committees and their contact details can be found on the next page.

In addition to the committees, there are our two businesses, the Bierstube and the Olydisco. There you can get involved for a little money right on your doorstep. The Bierstuben after-parties are also legendary, with internal parties sometimes lasting all night.

There are also numerous voluntary jobs where you can gain initial experience in various areas. For example, there are event technicians, who are responsible for the technology at all our events, company electricians, all-round craftssmen, carpenters, social media responsibles, IT and many more. If you are interested in one of these positions, please contact jobs@oly-dorf.de.

In addition to the set positions, every semester there is a group of people who organize either the OlyLust in the winter semester or Copa Connolly in the summer. Especially here it is important to work together in a large team so that our flagship events live up to their reputation!

The highest body in the association is the Presidium. This is made up of the association's board members, the managers of our businesses and the committee chairmen and manages the coordination of committee work, the control of business operations and the administration of funds generated in the businesses.

Any official resident of the village can become a member of the association by signing up; this does not entail any obligations or membership fees, but does give them the opportunity to participate in the opinion-forming of the self-administration, to be involved in the committees, to be employed in the association's businesses and to use the facilities.

Residence extension

As already mentioned, you can earn extra living time by volunteering in the village. You can read the exact regulations for this at Stuwerk, but in general you can earn up to 2-4 semesters depending on your commitment. There is a fixed allocation for this, e.g. each committee has a fixed number of places that can earn residence extension. For the exact allocation, it is advisable to simply visit the committee of your choice and ask.

There is also a "remaining place quota", which you can apply for as a member of the association at the end of the semester. Here, all remaining housing extensions are allocated to the people who were the most committed.

So if you would like to extend your time in Olydorf, don't hesitate to get in touch with us in the association or as a tutor!

General Assembly

The General Assembly takes place once at the start of the semester. Here, each committee and company has its own stand and introduces itself. This is also where the board members are elected and the executive committee is introduced. Later, some representatives of the Studierendenwerk come and answer any questions that the residents ask them.

Every member of the association has the right to propose motions, speak and vote at the general assembly. It is also possible to join the association at the entrance to the General Assembly. Tutors


Here in the Olympic Village, there are 20 tutors appointed by the Studierendenwerk who offer general educational, social, sporting and artistic events and thus help to intensify community life. The tutors organize numerous events in the village, mainly in the Tutoria and the GAPs. They are also your number 1 contact for problems of all kinds. All tutors are of course open to suggestions from the villagers.

The tutors are appointed for a term of office of one year by the Studierendenwerk. To apply, an email is usually sent out at the beginning of the semester. A tutor receives either an

honorary tutor allowance of ≤ 250 per month (10 months' remuneration for 12 months in office) or a 2:1 extension of living time for the duration of their work (maximum 2).
